PUBLIC MEETING MINUTES

The meeting was called to order at 4:01 by Mayor Dave Gattis followed by a Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America.

3. Resolution 2023-1921, A Resolution Of The City Council Of The City Of Belleair Beach, Florida, Extending The Previously Noticed And Advertised Qualifying Period For The March 19,

2024, Election, To Run Without Interruption Through Noon On December 18, 2023; Providing For The Qualifying Process; And Providing An Effective Date. (City Attorney Mora)

City Attorney Mora read Resolution 2023-1921 by Title only and provided a brief explanation that this resolution extends the qualifying period for residents to submit documentation to stand for the March 19, 2024 City Council election.

Councilmember Bankard asked if changing the deadline would expose the city to a challenge. City Attorney Mora said every action the council takes can be challenged.
