City of Belleair Beach, Florida**

**Monday, October 19, 2020
VIRTUAL MEETING, 6:00PM**

PUBLIC MEETING MINUTES

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Joseph A. Manzo, followed by a Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America.

Roll Call: Present were Councilmembers Robyn Ache, Marv Behm, Dave Gattis, and Rita Swope; Mayor Joseph A. Manzo, City Manager Lynn Rives, City Clerk Patricia Gentry, and City Attorney Fred Reilly. Councilmember Jody Shirley was unable to attend. Vice Mayor Glenn Gunn joined the meeting at 6:57pm.

1. Discussion of Communication Advisory Committee Report. (City Council has Final Report)

Councilmember Gattis: Residents have said that would like to receive information regarding the City. This survey offers several options for their preference to receive the information.

Consensus of Council was to send the survey out next month.

2. Discussion of Park and Recreation Board recommendation for Marina Rental Rates.

City Manager Rives stated the last increase for Marina Slip Rental rates was 14 years ago in 2006. He suggested a rate increase based on inflation and asked that it be discussed at the November 4, 2020 Park and Recreation Board Meeting.

Consensus of Council was for the Park and Recreation Board to review and consider based on inflation.

3. Discuss PCSO Traffic Enforcement Results, and Supplemental Service.

City Manager Rives reviewed the results of the supplemental traffic enforcement offered by Sheriff Gualtieri.

Consensus of Council was for City Manager Rives to discuss Council's request for more traffic tickets and less warning tickets, and the cost and value of various options of supplemental patrols with the PCSO.

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4. Discuss Recognition for Purcells.

Councilmember Swope suggested that a member of the PCSO and a member of the Blue Thunder present a certificate of acknowledgement for the Purcell's support of law enforcement.

Consensus of Council was to not present an award, and to monitor.

5. Discussion of Marked Walking and/or Bicycle Path for all City Streets.

Councilmember Behm stated this is regarding concern for the elderly and children on certain streets in the City.

Consensus of Council was for City Manager Rives to check measurements on streets that may have the width required for sidewalks prior to any collection of data, budgeting of funds, and input from the public.

6. Discussion on Town of Redington Shores Ordinance.

Mayor Manzo stated he had brought this as information only, and possible future use.

City Manager Rives will contact the Town of Redington Shores for additional information.

7. Discussion of Political Sign Ordinance.

City Attorney Reilly stated he had sent a memo to Council advising that the sign ordinance be overhauled and broken into two categories: commercial signs and non-commercial signs.

Consensus of Council was for City Attorney Reilly to review and draft the ordinance - due to the complexity, and for cost-efficiency. City Attorney Reilly will have a draft to Council next month.

8. General Business.

- Sailboats anchoring long-term in the Intracoastal: City Manager Rives will contact the cities of Clearwater and Madeira Beach for information on their resolution to the same issue
- There have no additional applications for the City Code Review Committee – City Manager Rives suggested that it be tasked to the Planning and Zoning Board

Consensus of Council was to refer to the Planning and Zoning Board, supplement the Committee with the Citizens who wish to serve and two Councilmembers, and assign specific areas of the Code.

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
